Pratt Fine Arts Center Announces 2009 - 2010 Artist Scholarships Application deadline July 1, 2009

Pratt Fine Arts Center invites local artists to apply for scholarships now available for 2009 - 2010. Reviewed by a panel of art professionals, these thirty merit- or financial need-based scholarships are offered in every visual arts discipline taught in Pratt's studios. Awards are used towards classes and studio rental at Pratt and are available for artists of color, adults and teens, and emerging and established artists.

"Thanks to the generous donations of local individuals, families and organizations, we are able to offer thirty scholarships for artists at every level," said Tracey Fugami Director of Education. "As an arts education and resource center, we are committed to making our classes available to everyone by offering scholarships, work study opportunities and tuition assistance."

Last year, Pratt awarded \$35,650 in scholarships to twenty-five emerging and established artists. Scholarships are valid from September 1, 2009 through August 31, 2010. Award recipients will be announced in August 2009.
