



Gregory M. Robinson Pathways Scholarship 2011 - 2012

Scholarship Background: This financial-need based scholarship was founded in 1997 by Greg Robinson, former Executive Director of Pratt, to support artists of color and to promote diversity at Pratt. This award is designed to provide intensive and sustained training and technical support for artists of color who wish to pursue a specific pathway.

Scholarship Description: For emerging artists in any of Pratt's studios, one \$2,000 award is available for classes and/or workshops at Pratt. A maximum of \$300 of the award may be used for supplies. The award must be used between September 1, 2011 and August 31, 2012.

Eligibility: To qualify for this scholarship, applicants must demonstrate a commitment to art. Pratt board members and their families, as well as Pratt staff, are not eligible. Instructors are eligible. A jury of artists and arts professionals will select the recipient.

Application: All applications must include a typewritten project proposal, not to exceed one page, explaining:

- What you intend to accomplish during the scholarship year.
- How your proposal relates to your previous experience.
- How this scholarship could enhance your artistic development and goals.
- Why financial assistance would be helpful to you in pursuing your artistic goals.

Also include:

- Up to 6 images (see guidelines) of current work, each labeled with a number and ordered as you wish to have them viewed. Also include your name and the title of each piece.
- An image list, including the title of the piece, its dimensions, medium, and the year it was produced. Please note that Pratt may use your images for promotional purposes. If applying for more than one scholarship, only one set of images is required
- A current resume or brief biography
- A completed scholarship application form
- 3 copies of entire application
- Pratt can not be responsible for the return of materials submitted

Deadline: Applications are due July 1, 2011. The scholarship recipient will be announced in August 2011. For more information, please email: pstokes@pratt.org. Application packets should be addressed to:
